- How to use a systematized planning form for your patients for logical and efficient treatment planning
- The importance of mounted models in the occlusal phase of planning
- How to perform a TMJ and muscle clinical examination
- Evaluation of the temporomandibular joints
- Differentiating a joint problem from a muscle problem
- Recognition of joint sounds and what they mean to stability
- Diagnosis of the TMJ and appropriate therapy when required
- Muscle evaluation and its impact on a restorative treatment plan
- When orthodontics is an indispensable part of the plan versus when it's an optional tool
